3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Transparency in
5	Taypayer-Funded Discrimination Act".

1	SEC. 2. PUBLICATION ON WEBSITE OF THE DEPARTMENT
2	OF EDUCATION.
3	Section 203 of the Department of Education Organi-
4	zation Act (20 U.S.C. 3413) is amended by adding at the
5	end the following:
6	"(d) The Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights shall
7	publish, on the Department's website, information regard-
8	ing religious exemptions to the requirements of title $\mathbf{I}\mathbf{X}$
9	of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1681
10	et seq.) in accord with this paragraph. Such information
11	shall include a list naming each institution of higher edu-
12	cation that requests such an exemption, the name of each

18	SEC. 3. PUBLICATION ON WEBSITE OF EACH INSTITUTION
19	OF HIGHER EDUCATION.
20	Section 485 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
21	U.S.C. 1092) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
22	lowing:
23	"(n) Disclosure of Religious Exemptions to
24	TITLE IX OF THE EDUCATION AMENDMENTS OF 1972.—
25	Each educational institution that requests or receives a
26	religious exemption to the requirements of title IX of the

10	"(3) Notice of request.—Notice that the
11	educational institution has requested an exemption
12	under section 901(a)(3) of the Education Amend-
13	ments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1681(a)(3)).
14	"(4) Notice of exemption.—If applicable
15	notice that the educational institution has received
16	an exemption under section 901(a)(3) of the Edu-
17	cation Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1681(a)(3))
18	"(5) COVERED PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS OF
19	BEHAVIORS.—A list of the personal characteristics
20	or behaviors to which each requested or granted ex-
21	emption applies.
22	"(6) COVERED ACTIVITIES OR PROGRAMS.—A
23	list of the activities or programs to which each ex-
